Just the Beginning

On Friday I felt a sense of relief as we finished our group celebrations of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We have had the opportunity to share God's forgiveness with all of the students in our religious education programs, with the students in both of our schools and in four communal celebrations of the Sacrament. These celebrations are a mammoth task, and it is always a relief to have them behind us. In my relief at having conquered the task, I can sometimes forget what we have been doing. We celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation so often that its power can become routine and its glorious wonder hidden by the regularity of celebration. Our celebration can become just one more thing that we check off of our "to do" list as we move through this holy season.



My reflection on today's Gospel reminds me to embrace the wonder of what we are about as we come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus' world is one that is bound on all sides by the demands of God's law. Observance of the Law is what binds the community to God and to each other, and the breaking of the Law is treated as a threat to the security of the people of God, and is dealt with harshly. The woman caught in adultery is completely powerless in her sin and shame before the Lord. The people surrounding her demand that the sin be dealt with and that the Law in all its harshness be applied. Surrounded by those demanding punishment and restoration of the Law's integrity, the woman has no defense and is rendered speechless. She is alone, abandoned and robbed even of words as she is thrown before Jesus. It is at this moment of complete weakness and abandonment that Jesus reveals his power and God's desire for "mercy not sacrifice." Jesus takes the law in hand and challenges the community of believers to understand it in a new way, "Let the one without sin cast the first stone." As Jesus' words wound the hearts of those demanding justice they melt away and return to their daily tasks and the Lord is left alone with the terrified, frightened and helpless sinner. He turns to her and gently reaches into her isolation with mercy and forgiveness. He asks her if anyone is left to condemn her, and when she answers, "No one sir," he speaks the amazing words of forgiveness, "Neither do I condemn you." He admonishes her to sin no more and sends her back to the world restored and renewed. This story reveals that justice is the beginning of mercy, not an end in itself. The recognition that we have broken the bonds of community and faith, the realization of what we have done and our need to restore what has been broken brings us to the threshold of the mercy of God. Justice is not the end of the story, but the beginning of living in the mercy of God. We have been celebrating a great mystery, a profound truth and a wondrous love in our celebrations of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We have not been performing our duty or checking off one more thing on our list of things to do, we have been wrapped in the mystery of Jesus, the face of the mercy of God.

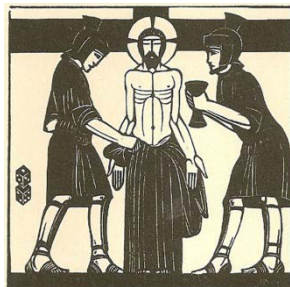

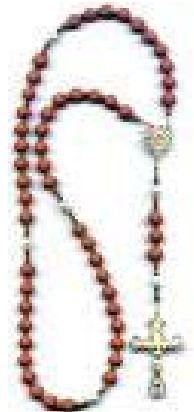

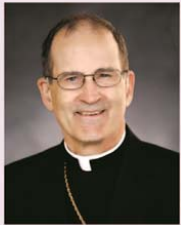

EVANGELIZATION CORNER: It's difficult to find someone in the United States who has not at least heard of Jesus Christ, but for one reason or another, that relationship hasn't flourished. That's because the first evangelization which started with the apostles, has accomplished what Jesus told them to do, which was to be witnesses to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). As St. John Paul II stated early in his pontificate, the new evangelization can be considered a secondary follow-up to the first evangelization that introduced us to the saving power of Jesus Christ. The New Evangelization is meant not only for those without any relationship with Christ, but also for those who have been introduced to Jesus, but who, for one reason or another, have not developed or maintained a relationship with Him. As St. John Paul II wrote in Redemptoris Missio, the new evangelization is, in part, for "Catholics [who have] lost a living sense of faith, or even no longer consider themselves members of the Church." We do this by reaching out to others. The "reaching out of our comfort zone" applies to you, me, your priest, the pope—everyone who currently does have a relationship with Christ so He can be shared.
