Transitions

My move from the strict and very busy schedule of my life as the pastor of the St. John Paul II Area Faith Community and vacation is not always easy. I spend the first few days of vacation



worrying that I should be doing more or that I should be busier than I am. It takes a while for me to adjust to the more relaxed, less demanding rhythms of vacation. Once I relax things are better, but then it comes time to write the bulletin cover, and it all starts again. Life, it seems, is a series of transitions.

The story of the wedding at Cana that the Church calls us to reflect on today is a story of transition in the life of Jesus, in the lives of his disciples, and it follows, in our lives also. This first miracle has many layers of meaning. The water in the jars can be seen as representing the waters of Baptism, and Jesus' move from years of preparation to the call of the Father and the anointing with the Holy Spirit as he begins his public ministry. The conversion of the water into wine mirrors the transformation of his preaching and ministry into the self-sacrifice, suffering and death that will accomplish our salvation. In a way, this miracle can be seen as the natural move from Baptism to the sacrifice of the Eucharist. It is a revelation of Jesus' power, mission and mercy. It is a proclamation of God's generous desire to fill us with joy and hope. It is an invitation to his disciples to enter into the mystery of salvation.

Just as Jesus moves to a new understanding, the call of this miracle is to see in Jesus' free acceptance of his ministry and mission a call for us to do the same. We have been baptized in the water made holy by the one baptized. We have received the gracious gift of being children of God, and we are invited to let the power of the Lord transform our lives. The inner grace of Baptism is called forth to transform our lives. We are invited to become generous in service and joyful in our witness to the power of Jesus in our lives. In our efforts to bring the lasting joy of Christ's transformation of our lives into the lives of everyone we meet Jesus is revealed.

Our lives are indeed a constant series of transitions. We move from call to service, from experiencing God's power to witness to it, and from being loved to giving ourselves in generous love to the needs of others. The transitions are sometimes ragged and uncomfortable. They can cause us anxiety and worry, but if we learn to trust in the Lord we will be drawn deeper and deeper in to the wonder of God and his desire to bring us everlasting joy.

Of any one hundred boys who become Scouts, it must be confessed that thirty will drop out in their first year. Perhaps this may be regarded as a failure, but later in life, all of these will remember that they had been in Scouting and will speak well of the program.

Of the one hundred, only rarely will one ever appear before a juvenile court judge. Twelve of the one hundred will be from families that belong to no church. Through Scouting, these twelve and many of their families will be brought into contact with a church and will continue to be active all their lives.

Six of the one hundred will become pastors.

Each of the one hundred will learn something from Scouting, and all will develop hobbies that will add interest throughout the rest of their lives. Approximately one-half will serve in the military, and in varying degrees, profit from their Scout training. At least one will use it to save another person's life, and many may credit it for saving their own.

Many will find their future vocation through merit badge work and Scouting contacts. Seventeen of the one hundred boys will become adult leaders and will give leadership to thousands of additional boys.

One in four boys in America will become Scouts but it is interesting to know that of the leaders of this nation in business, religion and politics, three out of four were Scouts.

This story will never end. Like the "Golden Pebble" of service dropped into the human sea, it will continue to radiate in ever-widening circles, influencing the characters of men through unending time.
