September 21: The Feast of St. Matthew

This Wednesday the Church will celebrate the feast of St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist. We know very little about this friend and disciple of Christ except what we hear about his call:

As Jesus passed on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the customs post. He said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. While he was at table in his house, many tax collectors and sinners came and sat with Jesus and his disciples. The Pharisees saw this and said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" He heard this and said, "Those who are well do not need a physician, but the sick do. Go and learn the meaning of the words, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' I did not come to call the righteous but sinners." (Matthew 9:9-13).

As a tax collector, Matthew would have been despised by his fellow Jews and considered a traitor. Tax collectors (or "publicans", as they are sometimes called) were collaborators with the oppressive Roman government and often padded their own pockets by taking more from their fellow citizens than was required. They were thought of as public sinners, and no self-respecting Jew would have been caught socializing with one, much less actually entering their place of work. Yet, Jesus was not concerned about this religious/cultural stigma but only with the soul of the person. So He entered the customs post, looked Matthew, the despised sinner, right in the eyes and invited him into relationship with Him. At that moment, a miracle occurs in Matthew's heart, and we're simply told that the poor man "got up and followed him."

One of the Fathers of the Church, St. Bede the Venerable, would describe what happened with these words: *Miserando, atque eligendo*. While it's difficult to translate this unique Latin formulation into English, he says, "Seeing with eyes of mercy, he calls him."

Pope Francis was so touched by Bede's spiritual description of the event that he took this phrase as his papal motto when he was elected our Holy Father. The Holy Father would later explain that this was exactly how Christ called him too: Looking at him with eyes of mercy, Christ called him to be his friend and disciple.

Isn't this the same for us, too? May we never doubt that Christ gazes with great love upon each one of us, and, looking at us with merciful love, calls each of us, too.
